




Common terms and acronyms used in this webinar

Term/acronym	Definition
ROVER	Road Vehicle Regulator: The administration system for the <i>Road Vehicle Standards Act</i> 2018.
ROVER account admin	Is a function in ROVER which allows users to view and manage account details, authorities to act and RAV submitters of the organisation or individual.
RAV	Register of Approved Vehicles: The RAV is where regulated entities are required to enter the mandatory data fields related to the NVES.
VTA holder	Vehicle type approval holder: The individual or company granted permission to provide a specific type of vehicle to the Australian market under a vehicle type approval.
IEV	Interim emissions value: A regulated entity's total emissions across the fleet of cars they supply over a performance period.
FEV	Final emissions value: A regulated entity's IEV less any NVES units they have extinguished to balance their IEV for a performance period.
REV	Running emissions value: Shows how a regulated entity is tracking in a given performance year based on their covered vehicles entered on the RAV to date.

How and when can I access the NVES Portal and Unit Registry account?

The NVES Portal will be accessible to individuals who have been granted the NVES Authority to Act permission through ROVER by a ROVER Admin.

ROVER and the RAV (requires Authority to Act)



I can grant access to the NVES Portal if:


• I am a ROVER admin for a VTA holder

As a regulated entity, before the NVES portal goes live:

• I need to confirm who has been assigned ROVER Admin access.

The introduction of the NVES portal and Unit Registry will not change existing ROVER or RAV roles or permissions.

NVES Portal





 I have been given the new NVES Portal Authority to Act permission by a ROVER admin for the VTA holder

An authorised representative can use the portal to open a unit registry account.

The NVES Registry **must be opened** for account information to be accessible

NVES Unit Registry (requires additional permissions)



I can access the registry if:

- I have been given the new NVES Portal Authority to Act permission by a ROVER admin for the VTA holder
- AND I have been added to the regulated entity's registry account by a registry admin

Manage permissions



I can manage permissions if:

- I have ROVER Admin Authority to Act (for the portal)
- I have registry admin permissions (for the registry)

What permissions are available?

NVES Portal

- Assigned via ROVER Authority to Act
- Can view portal dashboard

- Can view NVES RAV data, IEV and FEV
- Can apply to open a registry account
- Can view notifications from the Department

NVES Unit Registry account

Roles can be assigned in the unit registry once the account has been opened

Registry viewer



- Can view unit balances
- Can view unit transactions
- Cannot initiate or authorise transactions
- Cannot be combined with other unit registry roles

Initiator



- Can view the unit registry
- Initiate unit transactions for their account

Authoriser



- Can view the unit registry
- Authorise unit transactions created by a different user and submit to the Regulator

Registry Admin



- Can view the unit registry
- Add new users to the unit registry account
- Remove users from the unit rgistry account

Roles and access in the NVES Portal

New NVES roles build on top of existing access management for ROVER and will allow regulated entities to self-manage Authority to Act for NVES functions. Users will need to be assigned Authority to Act for the regulated entity in ROVER in order to access the NVES portal and Unit Registry, and if their Authority to Act in ROVER expires or is removed, that will also remove their NVES permissions.

Your ROVER Account Admin(s)


Your key to unlocking the NVES Portal...

- ✓ Can grant access to the NVES Portal for self and others
- ✓ Can view NVES position and download NVES data for the entity(s) they represent
- ✓ Can view requests for information (RFIs) from the regulator
- ✓ Can apply to open an NVES Unit Registry account for the entity(s) they represent
- X Cannot access or manage your unit registry account unless granted the Registry Admin role
- Know who they are and adjust ROVER permissions if required
- Review / establish agreements on roles and expectations


Applying for a NVES Unit Registry account

- Anyone with NVES Portal access can apply to open a unit registry account
- The first person to open a registry account will be granted registry account adminaccess
- They will need to fill out the registry account application form and will need to make
 2 fit and proper person declarations:
 - > For the regulated entity (as the legal person holding the registry account)
 - For themselves (as the individual authorised to apply for the account)
- They will need to make fit and proper persons declarations for all others they grant permissions to in the unit registry

Submitting NVES data – common mistakes and things you can do

DON'T



Enter RTC unless it is an MC category vehicle



Enter MIRO, CO₂ or RTC if the vehicle type is **Exempt** or **Not Applicable**



Leave CO₂ or MIRO blank if the vehicle type entered is **Type 1** or **Type 2**



Send correction requests to the NVES Regulator. Use RAV amendment process

Familiarise with the latest (May 2025) version of the RAV guide and validation rules



Ensure you are using the latest (Apr 2025) RAV .csv <u>submission template</u>



Include Motive Power values (optional but recommended)



Take time to ensure you submit true and accurate data

New Vehicle Efficiency Standard Rules (NVES Rules)

The New Vehicle Efficiency Standard Act 2024 (NVES Act) provides for the Minister to make legislative rules under the NVES legislation

"as required or permitted by the legislation, and as necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the legislation."

We plan to consult with interested stakeholders

- Those who are regulated under the NVES and will be accessing, using and interacting with the NVES Registry.
- Other stakeholders who are interested in the performance of the NVES

NVES Rules consultation

The department is preparing a discussion paper on the rules to be made under the NVES Act.

• *Timing:* the paper is planned to be released within the next week.

We are keen to hear your feedback during this consultation.

The paper will cover five topics:

- 1. Authority and responsibility of a Registry account
- 2. Opening a Registry account
- 3. Fit and proper person test
- 4. Dealing with units
- 5. Disclosure of information

NVES Rules consultation

Consultation will be open for 3 weeks

The department will notify stakeholders when consultation is open via email and the department's *Have your say* website: <u>infrastructure.gov.au/have-your-say</u>.

We will also include details for an online webinar to cover the topic in greater detail and address any questions.

From there, the department will consider the feedback received and provide advice to the Minister for her consideration.

The department then plans to release an *exposure draft* of the rules for consideration, before seeking Ministerial approval to register the legislative instrument on the Federal Register of Legislation.

We will keep you updated throughout this process.

Future rule making and consultations

While not covered in this round of consultation, additional rules may be made in the future on the following topics:

- 1. Issuing of units in specific scenarios
 - Adjusted RAV entries & Destroyed vehicles
- 2. Correction and rectification of the Registry
 - Applications for correction
- 3. Registration of equitable interests in units
 - E.g. to protect financial security interests when units used as collateral

ADR changes required to support the operation of the NVES

We are continuing to consult with the Emissions Testing Technical Working Group on Australian Design Rule (ADR) changes required to support the operation of the NVES.

ADR changes planned for adoption the end of this year include:

- New CO₂ testing requirements for cars, SUVs and utes over 3.5t GVM.
- A new fuel consumption label format for vehicles complying with Euro 6d testing requirements.
- A procedure to enable vehicles complying with Euro 6d testing requirements to calculate an NEDC equivalent CO₂ number for the NVES without additional testing.
