







Getting access to the NVES Portal from ROVER

The NVES icon will appear once you have **NVES Management** authority to act



Authority to act:


- Allows a user to take actions in ROVER on behalf of another user (e.g. make RAV entries)
- Self-management system: authorities are assigned by account admins





ROVER and the Portal

Session 2: Applying for an NVES Unit Registry account

What you can expect and how to get ready



NVES Unit Registry recap

- You can use units (by extinguishing them) to help you meet your NVES obligations,
 i.e. FEV <=0
- First units issued after 2025 IEV is released, which will be from February 2026
- Can't get units and use them without a registry account
- Only regulated entities (VTA holders that have entered a covered vehicle on the RAV)
 can apply for an account

Final emissions value (FEV) = Interim emissions value (IEV) – Units extinguished

Process to getting a registry account and using it

- 1. You apply
- 2. We assess and decide on your application
- 3. You add users and assign permissions
- 4. You get units
- 5. You use units

Fit and proper person declaration


- Helps ensure the integrity of entities and users that you are trading units with
- 2 parts to the declaration:
 - Entity that you are representing
 - Yourself (person filling out the application form)
- Consists of yes/no questions relating to topics such as:
 - Financial management
 - Criminal convictions
 - Professional integrity

Important: saying 'yes' to any of these questions does not automatically make your organisation 'ineligible' for a registry account

Portal vs registry permissions

Users with access to an entity's registry account will be able to see unit holdings information





Portal vs registry permissions

They will also be able to see detailed unit transaction information



Pending Transactions

The Unit Transaction Authorisations process involves the verification and approval of unit transactions within the registry system to ensure accuracy, compliance, and security. This includes authorising transactions such as unit issues, redemptions, transfers, and switches, while adhering to established protocols and regulatory requirements.

Authorised personnel are responsible for validating documentation, confirming investor instructions, and ensuring transactions are accurately recorded in the registry. This process safeguards the integrity of unit holdings and maintains investor confidence by ensuring all transactions are executed in a controlled and transparent manner.



Registry account administrators can do this via the **Admin Centre** in the NVES Portal




Permissions and transactions in the registry

You need both an **initiator** and **authoriser** to make a transaction from your entity's registry account. For a single transaction, these must be done by different users.



Checklist: End of 2025 performance period



By 1 December: Reconcile your data



By 15 December: Submit RAV corrections



Finalise outstanding discrepancies



Contact your account manager with questions

Correcting your NVES fields

If you are aware of an error on the RAV, you have a responsibility to notify the department and submit corrections.




- Submit a RAV Correction in the usual way
- The NVES Regulator will contact you asking for more information
- Once you provide more information, the NVES Regulator will assess your application
- The record will be unlocked if the NVES Regulator accepts your application





You can view, filter and export information about an entity's covered vehicles in the 'Vehicles' page of the NVFS Portal





Data for IEV calculation is the same data as that in the RAV




Division 2—Publication and sharing of information

86 Publication of information

- (1) The Secretary must publish the following information on the Department's website:
 - (a) for each person for whom there is a covered vehicle for a year beginning on or after 1 January 2025—the person's interim emissions value for the year;
 - (b) the name of each person who has a registry account;
 - (c) the number of units held in each registry account;
 - (d) such other information as is prescribed by the rules.
- (2) The Secretary must publish a person's interim emissions value for a year under subsection (1) as soon as practicable after the interim reconciliation day for the year.
- (3) The Secretary must ensure that information published under subsection (1) is kept up to date.





Involves steps outside and inside the NVES Portal



New Vehicle Efficiency Standard Rules (NVES Rules)

The New Vehicle Efficiency Standard Act 2024 (NVES Act) provides for the Minister to make legislative rules under the NVES legislation

"as required or permitted by the legislation, and as necessary or convenient for carrying out or giving effect to the legislation."

The department is seeking nominations for upcoming NVES Rules working groups.

NVES Rules consultation

The working group will meet weekly on either Thursday or Friday to discuss:

- 1. Authority and responsibility of a Registry account
- 2. Opening a Registry account
- 3. Fit and proper person test
- 4. Dealing with units
- 5. Corrections
- 6. Disclosure of information

The working group will run until the start of October



NVES Rules consultation

The department will consider the feedback received and provide advice to the Minister for her consideration.

The department then plans to release an *exposure draft* of the rules for consideration, before seeking Ministerial approval to register the legislative instrument on the Federal Register of Legislation.

Future rule making and consultations

While not covered in this round of consultation, additional rules may be made in the future on the following topics:

- 1. Issuing of units in specific scenarios
 - Adjusted RAV entries & Destroyed vehicles
- 2. Registration of equitable interests in units
 - E.g. to protect financial security interests when units used as collateral

ADR changes required to support the operation of the NVES

We are continuing to consult with the Emissions Testing Technical Working Group on Australian Design Rule (ADR) changes required to support the operation of the NVES.

ADR changes planned for adoption the end of this year include:

- New CO₂ testing requirements for cars, SUVs and utes over 3.5t GVM.
- A new fuel consumption label format for vehicles complying with Euro 6d testing requirements.
- A procedure to enable vehicles complying with Euro 6d testing requirements to calculate an NEDC equivalent CO₂ number for the NVES without additional testing.
